General conditions of entry

2. All nominations must have two nominators and include a one page summary on the nominee.
3. All documentation will be retained by Gold Coast City Council.
4. Contact details of nominators may be forwarded to local media.
5. Citizen of the Year nominees must be aged 26 years or over as at 26 January 2010.
6. Young Citizen of the Year must be aged 16-25 years as at 26 January 2010.
7. Late nominations will not be accepted.

Categories and criteria

Gold Coast Citizen of the Year – aged 26 years or over as at 26 January 2010

Recognises outstanding members of the community for their personal endeavours, achievements and community input. Consider the following criteria when nominating:

- How has the nominee made an outstanding contribution to the local community?
- What personal goals and objectives has the nominee achieved?
- How is the nominee an inspirational role model for the community?
- What degree of sacrifice / difficulty has the nominee experienced in their pursuits?

Gold Coast Young Citizen of the Year – aged 16-25 years as at 26 January 2010

Recognises young citizens for their personal endeavours, achievements and community input. Consider the following criteria when nominating:

- How has the nominee made an outstanding contribution to the local community?
- What personal goals and objectives has the nominee achieved?
- How is the nominee an inspirational role model for the community?
- What degree of sacrifice / difficulty has the nominee experienced in their pursuits?

Gold FM Community Service Award

Recognises individuals or groups that have provided outstanding service to the community. Consider the following when nominating:

- What community work has the nominee undertaken and how has this work contributed to the development of the community?

- What degree of sacrifice / difficulty has the nominee experienced in their pursuits?
- Has the work been undertaken on a volunteer or paid basis?
- Give examples of acts of kindness, generosity or other contribution undertaken by the nominee for the betterment of the community or a particular person or group.

Sports Achievement Award

Recognises the committed sports person, coach, administrator or official whose actions inspire and encourage others and enrich the community through sport. Consider the following when nominating:

- What personal goals, objectives or achievements has the nominee fulfilled?
- How is the nominee an inspirational role model?
- How has the nominee made a special contribution to the community?
- How does the nominee display the qualities of sportsmanship and a sense of fair play?

Environmental Achievement Award

Recognises individuals or groups who demonstrate genuine passion for the environment and strive to improve it through conservation, preservation, protection, replenishment and education. Consider the following when nominating:

- How has the nominee provided an outstanding contribution to the environment?
- What degree of sacrifice / difficulty has the nominee experienced in their pursuits?
- Has the work been undertaken on a volunteer or paid basis?

Cultural Achievement Award

Recognises individuals or groups involved in the city's rich cultural and arts community. Consider the following when nominating:

- How has the nominee provided an outstanding contribution to the cultural / arts community?
- What degree of sacrifice / difficulty has been experienced by the nominee in their pursuits?
- Has the work been undertaken on a volunteer or paid basis?

Award Presentation Ceremony

Winners will be announced at an award presentation breakfast on Friday 22 January 2010 at the Gold Coast Arts Centre. All nominators and nominees will be invited to attend the ceremony.
