INTRODUCING AMAN

AMAN (Australian Muslim Advocacy Network) is a registered, national organization intended to advocate for the protection of Muslims in Australia. Our aim is to play an integral part in the fostering of social harmony between all Australians and to counteract current perceptions of Islam and Muslims. After much consultation, AMAN was registered in 2014 when levels of Islamophobia peaked in Australia, driven in large part by disingenuous and malevolent articles like that of Peter Leahy claiming western society is likely to fight *"radical"* Islam for 100 years. An unfounded, bigoted view of Islam and Muslims per se.

Peter Leahy's arguments failed to tell the whole story. The impact foreign policy of many western nations including Australia, was having on individuals and groups who identified as Muslim. This, amongst a number of other ideological attacks, translated to a high level of physical assaults on Muslims around the country.

Driven by a need to present an alternative narrative to the Australian public, and after significant consultation with people around the country AMAN was formally constituted in 2014.
