Another important gathering held this year was the community leaders and intellectuals' get-together. We had three important events: two in Durack and one in the Gold

Taking these facts into consideration, Australian International Islamic College Board has decided to concentrate and construct the STEM building as a matter of priority and urgency, at around the cost of 4 million Dollars.
