Council Approves Application to extend Work Permit for Toowoomba Mosque

The current approval of Operational Work Permit of Toowoomba Mosque will expire at the end of August 2020. An application was dodged to extend the currency period for an operational works plan related to the Toowoomba Mosque to the Toowoomba Regional Council early August 2020.



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The applicant argued the COVID-19 pandemic had delayed progress on the works by three to four months, while fundraising efforts had also struggled, and requested for three year extension in view of the uncertainty about fundraising during the pandemic. The Council approved an extension by two years.

Carpet selection for Mosque

A highly respected local doctor has offered to donate all the cost of carpet, including installation, as part of his family charity. From many different designs and colours the donor has selected the design of the carpet very similar to that in the famous **Blue Mosque** (Sultan Ahmed Mosque) in Istanbul with a slight modification. This Mosque is a tourist attraction and was built in around 1611.



The owner of the factory was made aware of the burning of Toowoomba Mosque and he is considering a good discount on the price of the carpet.



Toowoomba Multicultural Youth Graduation

Islamic Society of Toowoomba with the support of Australian Multicultural Foundation ran Youth Leadership program in Toowoomba. Ten multifaith-multicultural local youth leaders of both gender joined the program. In spite of the difficult time of pandemic Covid19, they have done a great work. On 18 August 2020, they have presented a project paper entitled "Employment of Culturally Diverse Youth in the Toowoomba Region" during National Youth Leadership Program Graduation Webinar Event. The graduation program was co-hosted by



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Australian Multicultural Foundation and Museum of Australian Democracy. During their presentation, Farhan Mujib and Mithila Khan pointed out the challenges encountered by culturally diverse youth in finding their job opportunity. The study focuses on QLD government policies and legislations on multiculturalism, and then examine the multicultural health of youth employed by three organizations; Toowoomba Regional Council, Darling Down Police and University of Southern Queensland. The final touch-up of the white paper will be completed by the end of September and will be available on the website of Australian Multicultural Foundation.

2 students were promoted to Qur'aan reading level. We hope to get another 3 students get Qur'aan in September inshaaAllah. Parents are encouraged to accompany their children during the online lesson. Eidul Adha

This year Eidul Adha was celebrated in Toowoomba on Friday 31 August as per the announcement of the Grand Mufti of Australia. This was a very non-traditional Eid because of the covid-19 pandemic.

The Qurbani (sacrifice of animal) for the community was coordinated by Br Mohamed Abdalkareem and organised by AlMedina Meat, Inala Plaza, Brisbane. The meat was processed and delivered to Toowoomba Mosque on Saturday. This was a very well organised community service from the Islamic Society of Toowoomba and everyone was very happy with the management and timely delivery of meat.

Imam Abdul Kader organised to collect share of meat for the community at the Mosque and distributed to the relevant members of the community to enjoy the celebration.

Updates on Mosque Open Day

The 7th Annual Toowoomba International Food Festival and Mosque Open Day will be held on Saturday, 14 November 2020. This event is partially funded by Multicultural Affairs Queensland.

Muharram and 'Ashuraa: Lessons to learn

Muharram is the first month in the Islamic Arabic calendar named Hijri calendar. The month has been defined by the Prophet Mohammad (SAWS) as the "month of Allah". This signifies its importance along with it position in the group of 4 sacred months in Islam. Hence, the Prophet (SAWS) recommended us to fast the most after the obligatory fasting month of Ramadan. During Muharram, deeds of piety and righteousness carry greater rewards. Equally, the sins are to be heavier in the scale during this sacred month. This requires ongoing sincere and cautious approach in words and actions during this month and beyond.

A very special and great day in Muharram is the 10th day, which is known as the Day of 'Ashura. Historically, it's a special and unique day like no other that connects many of Allah's (SWT) Prophets (AS) in their struggle against tyranny and oppression. According to the Musnad of Imam Ahmad, it was 'Ashura when Prophet Nuh (AS) and his followers were rescued. The Ark of the believers safely got onto the mount of 'Jodi' and was saved from the flood. According to Sahih of Imam Bukhari and Imam Muslim, in the day of 'Ashura, Prophet Musa (AS) and his followers were saved from the tyrant Pharaoh and his people. Pharaoh along with his soldiers were dipped into the water till death. The list goes on. The most significant later event is the achievement of the honour of Martyrdom by Sayyidina Imam Hussain (RA) following his utmost struggle against the injustice and tyranny of Yazid and his alliance.

Every year, 'Ashura comes back to remind us that the struggle between Haqq Truth and Batil Falshood, between Madhlum oppressed and Dhalim Tyrant is of ongoing nature which never ends. All believers must stand firm on truth. They must offer their maximum to stop the oppressor and to put the oppression at end. This is because Allah (SWT) is the Truth and He stands with the oppressed.

Another important lesson of 'Ashura is that through Prophet Muhammad (SAWS) we Muslims are closer to Musa (AS) and to all other Prophets than their closeness to their followers. This is obvious in the saying of Prophet Muhammad (SAWS) to the Jew of Madinah: "I am closer to



Musa than you are". Hence, our Prophet (SAWS) made fasting on 'Ashura compulsory on Muslims following the tradition of Prophet Musa (AS). Later on, our Prophet wanted to fast another day along with the 10th of Muharram. This is a demonstration that all Prophets are brothers; their messages are common and same albeit their mothers are different.
