SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION PACKAGE**

Background

In Semester 1, 2008, two scholarships will be available to provide financial support to applicants in completing a Diploma of Business: specialisation Entrepreneurship at Southbank Institute of Technology, Kangaroo Point Campus. The program includes 18 weeks study (3 hours 2 nights per week and 5 Saturday workshops). The scholarships will also provide membership access to the Enterprise Centre at Southbank Institute of Technology for 6 months from Semester 2, 2008.

Eligibility

The successful applicant must:

- be from migrant or refugee background;
- be Australian citizens or permanent residents;
- currently reside in Brisbane City Council local government region;
- preferably speak a language other than English;
- have financial difficulties including having limited income (e.g. reliance on Centrelink benefits or low-wage work) and other expenses (e.g. caring for others, high medical costs etc);
- meet requirements of Certificate 4 in Spoken and Written English or equivalent English proficiency level;
- have minimum 2 year business operation experience as a business owner or equivalent work experience within a business in Australia and/or overseas; and have some knowledge of issues facing businesses in Australia.

CONDITIONS OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

Selection will be based on a number of criteria including:

- business operation and industry experience and management knowledge in Australia and/or overseas;
- Economic and/or personal need

The scholarship is valued at \$4,000 each over 1 year and will contribution to:

- Tuition fees (18 weeks)
- Membership of the Enterprise Centre (6 months)
