Photographic brief

The Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards celebrate the dynamic and strong cultural heritage of our communities.

Entries are sought that respond to the theme of 'Queensland's People in Places'.

Many people from various backgrounds have come to call the unique environment of Queensland their home, bringing their own characteristic beauty and flavour, as well as enhancing our highly skilled, educated, multilingual and diverse population.

Entries can be in black and white or colour, taken on film or transparency or taken digitally.

Photographs can not be computer generated.

The photograph must:

- **reflect or be inspired by multiculturalism in Queensland**
- **be one single moment in time**
- **be taken in Queensland.**

For the photograph to be eligible for the awards, **you must submit:**

- One hard copy 12" x 18" (30cm x 45cm) photograph with the entrants name, contact details and the photograph title clearly labelled on the reverse side of the image. The photograph **must not** be mounted or framed
- One electronic copy on CD provided in jpg or tif format at minimum 300dpi, dimensions no larger than 30cm x 45cm and labelled with the filename surname_firstname.doc eg: brown_emma.jpg
- A talent consent form – when taking a photograph of an individual, particularly one that identifies personal information of the person in the photograph, you will need to obtain a form of consent from the person or persons appearing in the photograph confirming the person appearing consents to the use and publication of their image. All photographers will be required to produce copies of the release to the Department of the Premier and Cabinet prior to further consideration of the photograph.

All entries must be in accordance with the 2006 Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards terms and conditions.

Entries close at 5pm on Friday 11 August 2006.

Categories and prizes

Awards are offered in the following:

1. Open

This category is open to professional and non-professional photographers who live in Queensland.

Entries in this category must respond to the Photographic Brief and be submitted in accordance with the terms and conditions of the awards.

Those entering the School student category are encouraged to apply in the Open category as well with a separate and signed nomination form.

Winner Open category: \$15 000

Highly Commended Open category: \$5000

2. School student

This category is open to any full-time student living in Queensland and studying at a Queensland Primary or Secondary School.

If you are under 18, you must obtain the permission of a parent or guardian to enter.

Entries in this category must respond to the Photographic Brief and be submitted in accordance with the terms and conditions of the awards.

School students are encouraged to apply in the Open category as well with a separate and signed nomination form.

Winner School student category: \$4000

Highly Commended School student category: \$1000

3. People's Choice Award

The People's Choice Award will be decided by popular vote and entries can not be made in this award.

So, how does it work?

The Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards judging panels will decide on a short list of entries from all entries received by 5pm Friday 11 August 2006. These short listed photographs will be on exhibition at the Queensland Multicultural Festival at Roma Street Parkland on 15 October 2006. People at the festival can vote for the photograph they feel best represents Queensland's people in places – the People's Choice Award.

You will also be able to vote for your favourite short listed photograph online at www.photographicawards.qld.gov.au.

Winner People's Choice Award: photographic equipment to the value of \$1000

4. Premier's Encouragement Award

The Premier's Encouragement Award is chosen from the entire selection of photographic entries, independent from the judging process, by the Premier and awarded to an entrant that displays potential in the photographic field.

Winner Premier's Encouragement Award: photographic equipment to the value of \$500

5. Minister's Regional Award

The Minister for Multicultural Affairs will award this prize to a photographer from regional Queensland, independent of the judging process.

Winner Minister's Regional Award: photographic equipment to the value of \$500

Helpful hints

Please make sure you have:

- followed the Photographic Brief
- included an unmounted, unframed 12” x 18” (30cm x 45cm) hard copy of your photograph with your name, contact details and the photograph title clearly labelled on the reverse side
- completed the talent consent form
- supplied one electronic copy of the photograph in jpg or tif format, minimum 300dpi with the filename as surname_firstname.doc
- read and agreed to the terms and conditions of the awards
- signed and attached the nomination form to your entry
- obtained a parent or guardian’s consent to enter if you are under 18.

Terms and conditions

Please ensure you have read and agreed to all terms and conditions.

1. The 2006 Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards are open to residents of Queensland only.
2. Submitted photographs must be taken in Queensland.
3. The submitted image must be completely photographic from either film camera or digital camera.
4. Computer generated images are not eligible for submission.
5. The submitted photograph must be in accordance with the photographic brief.
6. Submitted photographs must be the original work of the entrant and must not have been exhibited or published previously.
7. The photographer will, on request, provide original film, documentation or files to prove the submitted work is their original photograph and has not been computer generated.
8. Clearly displayed on the back of the photograph must be the following: entrant's name; address; email address; contact number; title of the photograph; and entry category.
9. It is the responsibility of the photographer to obtain all talent releases and to ensure that copyright and privacy have not been infringed.
10. To enter the 2006 Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards, photographers must submit their entry to the Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards, Events Coordination, Department of the Premier and Cabinet, PO Box 15185 City East Qld 4002. Entries must be received or postmarked by 5pm (AEST) Friday 11 August 2006. Late entries will not be accepted.
11. The Department of the Premier and Cabinet is not responsible for any entries that are lost, delayed or not received for any reason.
12. The submitted photograph must be provided as two copies: The first as a hard copy in the dimensions of 12" x 18" (30cm x 45cm); the second as an electronic file on CD in either a jpg or tif format at minimum 300dpi, dimensions no larger than 30 x 45 cm. The electronic filename must be titled surname_firstname.doc type eg: brown_emma.jpg.
13. Photographs must be accompanied by a signed nomination form.
If the photographer is under 18 years of age, a parent or guardian must provide their consent to enter the Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards.
14. The photographer warrants that:
 - (i) all details provided in the entry are true and correct
 - (ii) the photograph submitted as part of the entry is the entrant's original creation and work and does not infringe the rights (including copyright) of any other person
 - (iii) the photographer has completed the talent consent form and is not infringing the privacy rights of any person.

15. The entrant agrees to indemnify the Department of the Premier and Cabinet in relation to any loss or damage resulting from any breach of warranty.
16. The Department of the Premier and Cabinet may use any information (including personal information) provided by a photographer to contact him or her for any reason in relation to the Awards.
17. In the event that an entry is short listed, the photographer will need to provide to the Department of the Premier and Cabinet information on themselves and how the entered work responds to the photographic brief.
18. Employees of the Department of the Premier and Cabinet and their immediate family and any other people involved with the administration and judging of the Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards are not eligible to enter the Awards.
19. According to the quality of nominations, the judging panel reserve the right not to award a particular category and the prize money will not be distributed in 2006. Alternatively, they may decide to choose more than one award recipient in a particular category because of the standard of submissions.
20. In the event that the judging panel award more than one winner in a particular category, the total prize money will be distributed evenly amongst those award recipients.
21. The judges' decision is final and no negotiations will be entered into.
22. Entry is by self-nomination only.
23. Artwork will not be returned unless a stamped self addressed envelope has been provided by the entrant, and no responsibility will be taken for loss or damage of photographic submissions.
24. In the event that an entry is short listed for the Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards, the photograph becomes the property of the Department of the Premier and Cabinet. The photographer consents to the Department of the Premier and Cabinet reproducing, publishing or exhibiting his/her submitted photograph without notice and without payment or attribution for the purpose of promoting the Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards and/or the Queensland Multicultural Festival and/or Education Day. The photographer also consents to the Department reserving the right to use the short list photograph for any:
 - publication, calendar, catalogue, exhibition or tour, project reporting related to the above events
 - website and Department intranet related to the above events
 - print, television, internet and/or radio advertising and promotions related to the above events.
25. In the event that an entry is short listed for the Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards, the photographer consents to the Department of the Premier and Cabinet reproducing, publishing his/her submitted photograph without notice and without payment or attribution in any medium including the Internet, CD-ROM or other multimedia in any publication, calendar, catalogue, exhibition or tour, project report

related to the Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards and/or the Queensland Multicultural Festival and Education Day, the Awards website, the Department's intranet, and in any print, television, internet and/or radio advertising and promotions related to the Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards and/or the Queensland Multicultural Festival and Education Day, and Queensland Government publications relating to the Small Business, Information Technology and Multicultural Affairs Queensland portfolio.

26. Subject to clause 24 and 25, the entrant retains copyright in the image of the submitted photograph.
27. There is a limit of three entries per individual. Each entry must be a different photograph and provide a separate and complete entry form. Electronic copies must also carry different file names eg: brown_emma1.jpg; brown_emma2.jpg.
28. By entering the Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards the entrant further agrees to indemnify and hold the Department of the Premier and Cabinet and its respective officers, directors, employees, agents, subsidiaries, successors, and assigns, harmless from any liability or damages of any kind, including legal fees and costs, resulting from any claim of infringement or other proprietary right of any person or entity in relation to their entry.
29. To the full extent permitted by law, the Department of the Premier and Cabinet will not be liable for any injury, damages, expenses or loss whatsoever (whether direct or inconsequential) to persons or property as a result of any person entering into the awards or accepting any prize.
30. Short listed entries will be on exhibition at the Queensland Multicultural Festival at Roma Street Parkland on 15 October 2006. Public at the festival can vote from these short listed photographs for the People's Choice Award.
31. Award recipients will be announced and will be presented at a ceremony by 30 November 2006. Prize money will be distributed by way of cheque on receipt of the appropriate invoice/tax invoice and once the recipient/s has been announced.
32. Prize winners will be notified by mail, telephone or e-mail as soon as reasonably possible following the determination of winners. The award recipients' names and the city/town/suburb in which they live may be announced on award sponsor/supporter websites and any Queensland Government website.
33. If there is an event beyond the reasonable control of the Department of the Premier and Cabinet which prevents or hinders the conduct of the Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards or the Department's ability to deliver the prize to the winner, then the Department of the Premier and Cabinet may cancel the awards at its sole discretion.
34. Each entrant agrees to be bound by these terms and conditions and the Department of the Premier and Cabinet may, at its discretion, refuse to award any prize to any entrant who fails to comply with the Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards terms and conditions.
35. The promoter of the Premier's Multicultural Photographic Awards is the State of Queensland through the Department of the Premier and Cabinet, PO Box 15185 City East Qld 4002.

Important privacy information

The Department is collecting the information contained in the nomination form to verify your consent for use of your image or recording for the purposes contained in the Consent Form. Your consent to use your personal information is required in accordance with the Queensland Government's Information Privacy Standard 42. The information privacy principles contained within this Standard govern the collection, use, storage, security, and disclosure of personal information.

If you are taking a photograph of an individual, particularly one which identifies personal information of the person portrayed in the photograph, you will need to complete and collect the talent consent form of release from the person or persons appearing in the photograph confirming the person appearing consents to the use and publication of their image. For an individual under the age of 18, their legal guardian will need to complete the talent consent form on their behalf. All photographers will be required to complete the talent consent form of release to the Department of the Premier and Cabinet prior to further consideration of the photograph.

Only authorised departmental officers have access to the information you have supplied. Your personal information contained in this form will not be disclosed to any other third party without your consent, unless authorised or required by law.
