

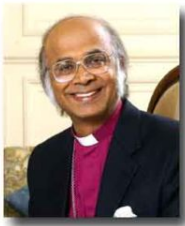

Speakers



Bishop Michael Nazir-Ali is the Anglican Bishop of Rochester (UK). Born in Pakistan, his family background is both Christian and Muslim. He is President of the Network for Inter-faith concerns of the Anglican Communion, and has written several books on the encounter between Christianity and Islam, including *Conviction and Conflict: Islam, Christianity and World Order*.



Dr. Mohamad Abdalla is Director of the Griffith University Islamic Research Unit and Co-Director of the National Centre of Excellence for Islamic Studies Australia. He was the Acting Imam of the Kuraby Mosque in Brisbane for a number of years; served as the Vice-President of the Australian National Imams Council for a short period and was the Chairperson of the Queensland Muslim Community Reference Group.

Bishop Michael and Dr. Abdallah will address the particular issues and challenges which confront Christianity and Islam in their respective contributions to a religiously plural society. There will be opportunity for questions and discussion.
