[Editor] We can't let your letter pass without recognizing the hard work and dedication that you have put into this cause over the years.



Janeth Deen's plan to build a tough-love work for the dole scheme has been taken to the Federal Government after the idea won backing from a panel of local leaders and many others.

In support of this winning idea several compelling arguments were made.


"The idea is that....registered community groups could contact Centrelink and access the skills of people who are unemployed," Ms Deen said.

"Because with these community groups if they're volunteers and they can't do everything themselves they should be able to get people to paint, mow the grass and help out without cost."

Ms Deen said volunteering should be compulsory for dole recipients.

She said the program could reduce crime, teach unemployed people new skills and help groups with their day-to-day activities. The idea, raised and finessed by several people including Janeth Deen who runs the Queensland Muslim Welfare Association OP shop, and Hetty Johnstone from Brave Hearts, was meant to get people working while they are receiving benefits.

Free toys this Christmas

FIVE days before Christmas the presents will flow early in Woodridge.

The Muslim Welfare Association will be giving away free toys to children in line with their Eadul Adha celebrations, which this year happens to coincide with Christmas.

Local families - whother Muslim or not - are invited to go the Parkland Plaza back car park and seject sonic free second-hand toys on December 28.

Ridul Adha refebrates the moment when God asked Abraham to sacrifice his only son Isaac, but after Isaac was bound to an altar, the angel of God stopped Abraham at the last minute.

From this story, the Muslim tradition is to give presents to children during Eidui Adha.

This is the first giveaway of its kind the Muslim Welfare Association shop has done, since it opened its doors earlier this year.

It is the first Muslim welfare shop in Australia and was set-up to help anyone struggling and in need of items such as clothes.

"Muslim people want to play their role as well," Muslim Welfare Association president, Janeth Deen, said

The items in the second-hand shop, including the toys, are donated from Muslim and non-Muslim people in the community.

MFC to the rescue of Special School pupil



Jaden Dennis (pictured left with Ms Janeth Deen) is a young man who has spent his whole life in and out of hospital. He suffers from P36 syndrome which is a debilitating illness that affects his whole body. He often suffers from seizures. His mother Tanya is his full time career.

This is just one student who attends the Holland Park Special School which also incorporates the Xavier school for students with major disabilities. There are about twenty three students in this centre.

The school is short of the special equipment it needs in its work with these children. The Government does not fund the equipment they so desperately need. The school's P & C raised some of the funds for a walking frame for the use of the children. They were short of some of the funds. The Muslim Charitable Foundation (MCF) supplied the balance needed and the school is now in the process of ordering the frame.

Janeth Deen was given a tour of the facilities when she went to hand the cheque from MCF over to the school. She met the staff and children at the centre. The school has a beautiful environment with caring staff who are devoted to the children in their care. They are from all age groups and there are two Muslim children amongst their number.

It is not an easy task for the parents to have to take their children to the school. They need special equipment to move them in and out of the school as well as especially fitted vehicles. Disability equipment is highly priced and there is only limited funding from the government. The parents have to struggle to meet the costs.

MCF funds have helped several disability families who are struggling to supply every day necessities for their families as well as for the disabled member of their family.

The volunteer award recognized Ms Deen's efforts in championing the values of multiculturalism and promoting community harmony and positive community relations through her volunteer efforts and dedication.

Qurbani meat distribution in Logan (2011)

Zac's Halal Meats in Woodridge worked in overdrive to process and pack, ready for distribution, in excess of 800kg of meat donated by Muslim Aid Malaysia. Imam Ghazaleh was contacted by Muslim Aid Malaysia to oversee the delivery of the Qurbani meat and further organise the distribution through a Muslim organisation in Logan city.

With the assistance of Janeth Deen who shortlisted recipients from databases kept at the Welfare Shop and MCF in the Logan area, the distribution was achieved. Logan city is a low socio-economic area with over one hundred and eighty-six different Ethnic Groups. It settles a great proportion of Migrants, Refugees and Asylum Seekers. It also houses many single parents and unemployed members of our community.

Janeth contacted Access Services who are responsible for settling many of the migrants and refugees, Multilink who also work with refugees. These organisations cooperated and jointly arranged for the recipients to collect their 5kg meat parcel from Zac's Halal Meats.

It was heart-warming to see the gratitude on the faces of the recipients, many of them had not been able to afford meat for many months, due to the high cost of living.

The Australian Halal Food Services kindly covered all costs involved in the distribution of this meat including transportation and processing charges. Special mention must be made of Nolan Meats for the slaughter and initial meat processing.

Founder of the Queensland Muslim Welfare
Association, Ms Janeth Deen, was pleasantly surprised
by the arrival of the LNP newly elected state MP and
Brisbane City Council Councillor for Stretton who arrived
at the shop to help with the clean up and transport of
the remaining goods.

Ms Deen told CCN she was very appreciate of their help: "These people have only just ended a long period of campaigning for their positions. They have not had time to recover from their hard work, yet they turned up in their team shirts and worked cheerfully to help a welfare shop which was not even in the boundaries of the Brisbane City Council, nor in their electorate."

The Welfare shop has ceased operating and the stock from the shop has been sent to the people of Fiji in two containers that have left from the Kuraby Mosque.

The QMWA Committee thanked everyone who supported the shop during the three years it operated.

Ms Janeth Deen will work with the Muslim Charitable Foundation while Ms Wilma Bothwell, who has suffered health problems, will retire.

A similar initiative is being undertaken with a second container being loaded at the Gold Coast Mosque.




Please do not leave goods at Janeth Deen's home as we have not received any more requests for clothing at present.






